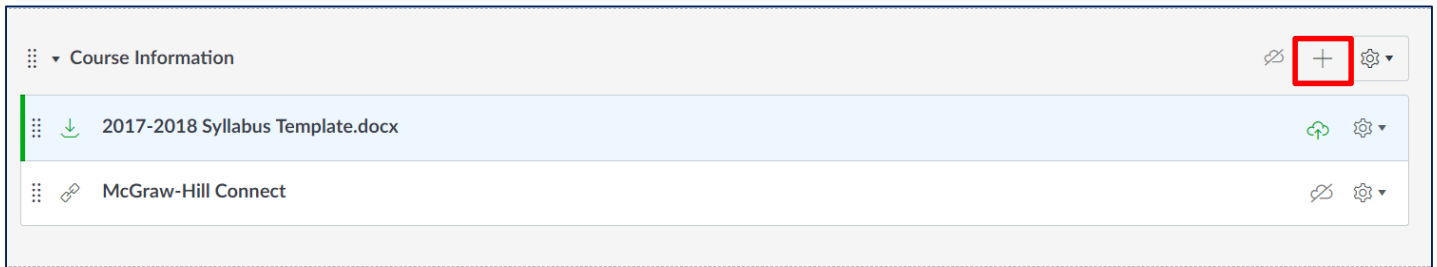


# Graded Panopto Quizzing in Canvas

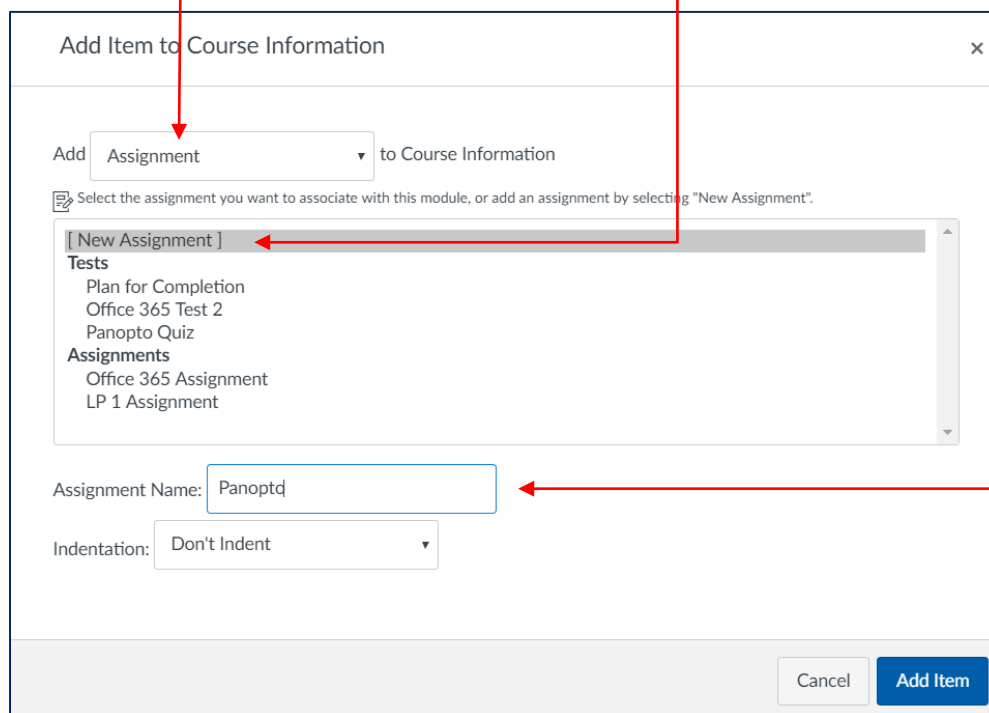
Panopto Interactive Quizzes have the ability to be synced to the grade book within Canvas. This will allow instructors to both see who has taken it, what they have scored, and to add those scores to the users grades for the course. Students enrolled in the course will be able to see and take the assignment through Canvas.

*\*\*Note: At this time Panopto Quizzes may not be embedded into Canvas.*

1. **Log in** to Canvas and navigate to a course where you want to create a Panopto video based assignment.
2. Go to the Modules tab and click the plus sign on the module you want the Panopto quiz to be included in.



3. Select **Assignment** from the drop down and select **New Assignment**. Enter the **Assignment Name** and click **Add Item**.



4. The module link will now display in the module. Click on the link and select **Edit**.

5. Now you can give the **Assignment** a title and assign a number of points you want it to be worth.

6. Select the **External Tool** option for **Submission Type**, check **Load Tool in a New Tab**, and then select the **Panopto Assignment** external tool from the **Find** button menu.

7. This will pop up the embedded upload control and you can select what Panopto video you want to set as the assignment. Once selected, click **Insert** and go to the next step.

8. You can set the due date and when the assignment opens and then click **Save** for later editing or **Save & Publish** so students can take it.
