HOW TO CREATE A DISCUSSION QUESTION...

Rather than repeating material from the textbook in lecture, much class time will be devoted to clarifying topics covered in readings, tying topics together, and expanding ideas introduced in the text.

Thus, questions should seek to clarify points of confusion or to expand ideas just introduced briefly. For the most part, simple factual questions should be avoided (unless the facts are in dispute). The instructor will assume that students have a clear understanding of topics not covered in questions, and students should be prepared to contribute to class discussions on all areas not asked.

Toward this end, students must read assigned materials before class and formulate one discussion question & 'submit' the question to the Blackboard Discussion Board Sunday by 11:59 PM. Some appropriate types of questions are:

1. Questions to clarify ideas
2. Questions about the relationships between ideas or approaches
3. Questions regarding assumptions behind approaches
4. Questions concerning the motivation or necessity of ideas or protocols
5. Questions that elicit student responses that must consist of more than one sentence
6. Questions that allows different or original responses or pattern of responses
7. You do not need to have completely worked out answers to all your questions, though you should have some possible answers.

Remember that your purpose is to stimulate analysis and discussion, not to test factual recall. Therefore, questions should be open-ended. If you can answer a question in a few words, don't use it.

CLASSROOM DISCUSSION SCORING GUIDE
